Lt Rycroft is the only commissioned officer on the Landbeach War Memorial; however, don't be too thrilled, as his link with the village is rather tenuous. His father, John, was a Rubber Merchant who moved from Devon to Waterbeach Rd, Landbeach in the early years of the twentieth century. Nelson himself was an engineering apprentice living in Coventry at the time of enlistment. So I need your help - WHERE on Waterbeach Rd did the family live? If you live in one of few pre-1911 houses on Waterbeach Rd, please can you look for Rycrofts in your deeds?

As you will see from the notice on p.2, All Saints' Church, which is usually open during the daytime, has had to be locked due to vandalism. The acts point to the vandals being bored children, so it is hoped that it will be possible to open the church again once the summer holidays have ended. The tragedy of this is that the church would **love** to welcome these children to come in - but to do something constructive, not to mess around. There is so much of interest in All Saints' even if you are not churchgoers - local history, architecture, music, bellringing, nature. Ideally, the village would be using the church daily as a shared space for social and educational activities. That would be the best safeguard against vandalism. Please do share ideas about how the community could use this special building.

HOOP - Housing Options for Older People

A South Cambridgeshire District Council 6-month pilot project

The project offers specialist housing advice and support to older people. The customer journey starts with a questionnaire asking older people (over 65s) about their home and how it suits them. This can be completed on line or via a leaflet. The answers are then used to put people in touch with local housing options (sheltered housing, extra care schemes), support services and community groups that can provide a mixture of practical support and advice - helping people to make informed choices about their housing and wellbeing at an early stage.

This is only the second place in the Country the service has been localised, up until now HOOP has been a national tool. We want all people to live independently in their own homes for as long as possible and are committed to helping them to do that, therefore this pilot proposes more local solutions and suggests alternative independent housing opportunities and support to help people think through their housing options.

A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon Improvement Scheme - This £1.5bn project by the government company Highways England includes a major new bypass to the south of Huntingdon and upgrades to 21 miles of the A14, boosting the local and national economy and cutting up to 20 minutes off journeys. The contractors have finished clearing the site, built their construction compounds and started the permanent works including earthworks and bridge building. Keep Waterbeach Rural - In the old telephone box (by Abraham's Close) there is a copy of a petition from this group about the Waterbeach Barracks development. This petition may be summarised as "No development on barracks until transport, health and educational infrastructure are improved, and greater consideration given to impact on surrounding villages". Please read it and, if you agree with it, do sign.

Waterbeach Barracks - The U&C outline application is in and has been opposed by all the local PCs for many reasons, primarily the lack of any A10 infrastructure improvements and sense of over development on the site. There is nothing new from RLW (the developers for the other part of the site). The A10 corridor study is expected later in the year.

Shed Security Advice from Cambridgeshire Constabulary

Consider painting your house number and postcode onto your valuable gardening equipment (e.g. lawnmower, strimmer and tools). This makes them much less attractive to potential thieves as it makes them more difficult to sell on, and also increases the chances of the property being recovered and returned to its rightful owner if it is stolen.

Avoid storing valuable items such as power tools, fishing tackle or golf clubs in a shed. These items should be stored inside your home or a secure garage.

If you have been working in your garden ensure that you lock away tools such as spades or forks when you're finished. Tools left out overnight could be used by an intruder to gain access to your property.

If you don't intend to use the windows in your shed you can make them secure by screwing them shut or fitting window locks. Hanging old curtain or netting up against the window will prevent any prying eyes from seeing what is stored in your shed.

Locks and Bolts

There has recently been a rise in shed break-ins. The most effective way to secure shed doors is to fit a strong hasp and staple (also called a 'padbar'). Secure this with coach bolts (long bolts with a smooth head that cannot be undone with a screwdriver or spanner) and lock the hasp over the staple with a closed shackled padlock.

You can further protect your shed with items such as 'shed bars' and larger items such as cycles can be secured to shed shackles. These and other approved products can be found at www.soldsecure.com or www.securedbydesign.com.

Secure the shed door hinges with 'clutch head' or 'coffin' screws. These are a special type of screw that once fitted can only be unscrewed with a special tool. They can be purchased from DIY outlets and on the internet.
