Buses - There has not been much response about the changed bus service. The PC cannot afford to set up anything for only a few people.

Centenary of end of WWI - The Parish Council agreed to plant a tree with a plaque in remembrance of WWI

Dogs - Please keep dogs off the Recreation Ground. Please clean up dog mess in the village. There are several dog bins and bags so please use them. There have been several cases of dog mess on the footpath which is not very nice for people with prams, scooters etc.

Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs - The sign is now being rotated for two week periods at locations in Milton, Waterbeach and Landbeach. So far we've done one period in each village and they seem quite effective as well as the traffic volume and speed data being produced being very valuable. Many people have mentioned that it has made them aware of their speed and consequently to reduce it. So far, it's interesting to see that most people don't exceed the speed limit and those that do are rarely more than a little above it. This is a good case for the MVAS – it makes law abiding folk think and slow down a bit. The few that go a lot faster are not likely to be swayed by the MVAS, but adding the things that might stop them – humps, chicanes etc. - inconveniences everyone else. More data over time will give us the chance to be more certain of speed profiles and problems so that we can ask for more targeted measures e.g. asking for a police speed trap at a certain problem time.

September Parish Council Meeting - Date has changed to 10th Sept

Waterbeach New Town - RLW attended the Parish Council meeting on 9 July 2018 to update on their proposals. The Parish Council refused their application for planning permission for the development of up to 4,500 homes in Waterbeach. SCDC carried out a consultation in July.

Bus News

County Councillor Anna Bradnam reports that, from Mon 30th July, there will be one extra bus, a no. 19, between Landbeach and Cambridge on Mondays to Fridays. This is actually Whippet's old 196 route between Waterbeach and Cambridge via Horningsea, taken over by Stagecoach and extended to Landbeach. On the one hand, it takes you to useful places, on the other hand it doesn't give you much time in Cambridge!

The bus to Cambridge leaves Cock Fen Lane (aka Cottenham Turn) at 09:30, arriving at Drummer St Bus Station bay 6 at 10:14.

The bus to Landbeach leaves Drummer St Bus Station bay 6 at 12:15, arriving at Cock Fen Lane (aka Cottenham Turn) at 13:02.

Owl Nest Boxes Update

The nest box team have inspected all of the owl boxes around Landbeach and report as follows:

The one in the church yard had evidence of Stock Doves nesting in it.

The one at Manor Farm - put there to replace the one in the Tithe Barn - has had Tawny Owls in it (we were told). We could not inspect it because of a large herd of cows beneath it.

We found 3 Barn Owl chicks on Walnut Farm, 1 Barn Owl chick on Chestnut Farm, a single Barn Owl with 3 cold eggs on Rectory Farm, We also have a single Barn Owl chick at Old Beach Farm.

We also found some well grown Kestrels on Rectory Farm, and evidence that Kestrels had bred on New Farm.

Swift breeding in the nest boxes around the village was also very successful.

Report of wreath laying for 1917 WWI dead *Barbara Le Gallez*

Pte Victor Percival Peacock (Suffolks), who died on 9th April 1917, is commemorated on the Arras Memorial to the Missing, France. The Memorial, in the west of the city, near the 17th-century Citadel, is a long wall made of white stone and red brick and shaped in a series of loops. On the inside of the wall are inscribed the names of the missing. In the cemetery behind the memorial, a large number of gravestones stand in neat rows in a lawned area enclosed by mellow brick walls and brightened by a profusion of flowers. In this photo of the memorial and cemetery, Victor's name is on the part of the wall to the far right.



2nd Lt Nelson Wynne Rycroft, (Bedfordshires), who died on 25th September 1917, is commemorated on Tyne Cot Memorial to the Missing, near Ieper in Belgium. The cycle path out to Tyne Cot follows the line of an old railway, with every so often a reminder of the war such as the remnants of a German bunker. It is hard to imagine this rolling, fertile, wealthy countryside as a sea of mud and death. Tyne Cot itself looks quite forbidding when you turn a corner and catch sight of it – a very long wall of dark flints, perched up on a slight rise. The huge cemetery had a rather numbing effect on me. In this photo of the small bay where Nelson is commemorated, his cross is visible on the left.
